

PRIČA O PORODICI PLAVČIĆ



Teška životna priča Ane Plavčić počinje još prije ratnih dešavanja 1992. godine, kad je ostala udovica, sa troje djece – dva sina i kćerkom. Do 1992. godine živjeli su u mjestu Nadioci kod Viteza. Anin sin ima cerebralnu paralizu, što je to bio jedan od razloga da početkom ratnih dešavanja u BiH, porodica Plavčić izbjegne u Njemačku, kako bi bolesnom članu porodice pružili bolje uvjete za liječenje. Anina kćerka je ostala u Njemačkoj, udala se, te tu živi i danas. Ostatak porodice se 1996. godine vratio u Nadioke, gdje žive kao podstanari u kući Anine zaove. Trenutno ova porodica broji šest članova. Skupa žive Ana, sin koji boluje od paralize, te drugi sin koji ima ženu i troje djece. Anini unuci su mladi ljudi, koji pohađaju fakultet, odnosno srednju školu. Porodica Plavčić živi od Anine penzije od 320 KM, snahine plate od 300 KM, te od prihoda koje ostvaruje jedan od sinova pri povremenom odlasku na rad u Njemačku, kod sestre. Ovi skromni i vrijedni ljudi na svaki način pokušavaju da pomognu bolesnom sinu, odnosno bratu. U okviru Regionalnog stambenog programa (RSP), porodici Plavčić je izgrađena nova kuća, te su obezbijedene prilazne rampe za paraliziranog člana porodice. U projektu pomoći Catholic Relief Service-a (CRS) dobili su motokultivator sa kosilicom, koji im izuzetno olakšava rad i dobro služi na imanju veličine oko 100 dunuma. Proizvode različito povrće, a imaju i kravu koja im donosi prinose u vidu hrane za vlastite potrebe. Susjedi ove porodice za njih kažu da su vrijedni ljudi, svakodnevno rade i spremni su pomagati jedni drugima. Porodica Plavčić iskazuje iskrenu zahvalnost donatorima RSP-a koji su im pomogli da žive dostojanstveno, kako bi svim članovima ove porodice budućnost bila olakšana.

THE STORY ABOUT PLAVCIC'S FAMILY



The difficult life story of Ana Plavčić begins before the war in 1992 when she stayed widowed, with three children - two sons and a daughter. Until 1992 they used to live in village Nadioci, near Vitez. Ana's son has a cerebral paralysis, which was one of the reasons this family went to Germany at the beginning of the war in BiH, to provide better treatment conditions for the ill family member. Ana's daughter has stayed in Germany, where she married and still lives. The rest of the family came back to Nadioci in 1996, where they live as subtenants in home of Ana's sister-in-law. Currently, this family has six members. Ana is living together with her paralyzed son, the

other son, his wife and their three children. Ana's grandchildren are young people, enrolled in university, respectively, in high school. Plavcic family lives from Ana's pension of 320 KM, her daughter-in-law's salary of 300 KM and from the income earned by one of the sons who sometimes leave to work in Germany. These modest and hardworking people are trying to help their ill family member in every possible way. Within the scope of Regional Housing Program (RHP), the new home for Plavcic family was built and access ramps were provided for the paralyzed family member. The Catholic Relief Service (CRS) has provided a rotocultivator with a lawnmower, which makes their work easier and serves well on their property land. Family produces different vegetables and they have cow that provides food for the family. Their neighbors say that this family is a hardworking one - they work every day and are ready to help each other. Plavcic family expresses sincere gratitude to donors of RHP who helped them to live dignified life therefore the future of the members of this family will be eased.
